The minutes of the March board meeting were read and approved without correction.

The treasurer reported the standing balance.

The shop foreman reported the creation of a shop website, and average daily shop incomes.

Old business: A proposed September picnic was tabled for further discussion, and the Burro Creek in April is scheduled as planned.

New business: Due to the unexpected loss of the previous general meeting location, a new location was found, and all necessary paperwork signed.




Upcoming Events



Burro Creek - April 17 - 22. Burro Creek is is located 60 miles northwest of Wickenburg on Highway 93. From Kingman, travel east 17 miles on Interstate 40, then south 53 miles on Highway 93. The recreation site turnoff is one mile south of Burro Creek Bridge. From the signed turnoff, continue 1.5 miles to the recreation site via the paved access road. SNGMS has an annual camp out at Burro Creek each spring. There is fun, fellowship, and some field trip opportunities in the area.

Egg Hunt/Picnic - May 19. The club will sponsor a family picnic that will include an egg hunt for the kids, a rock swap, and games for all ages. It will be held at Flamingo Park (Flamingo and Jones) from 11 AM - 2 PM and SNGMS will furnish hamburgers and hotdogs. Club members are asked to bring side dishes, remembering to avoid easily spoiled items due to the heat. A signup will be available at future meetings.



Ely NV area - June 14 - 17. An annual camp out near
Ely NV is another SNGMS activity. This year it will be at
the Illipah Recreation area and is scheduled for June 14 through 17th
(Thursday through Sunday). Hotel accommodations are available in Ely if
you don't like to camp. Make your reservations NOW - other activities in
the area are filling the rooms quickly! Again the activities include field
trips in the area. Illipah Reservoir Campground is located 40 miles west of
Ely on US 50. It is a free BLM campground. Access to the camp is down a
good 2 mile gravel road (signed from the highway). More detailed
directions are: 37 miles west of Ely on U.S. Hwy 50, turn at the highway

sign for Illipah Reservoir and continue 0.1 miles to a road junction, turn left and continue 1.3 miles to the campground. The road is 2WD accessible. Fishing is available, and there are several ghost towns and mining camps within a few miles of the campground.

Brurro Creek Damsonite

Damsonite is a gemstone found only near Burro Creek and all known easily accessible deposits have been removed. This makes it a rare stone. It is a lovely purple color calcedony and was named after the Damson plum. It resembles lavender jade and is referred to as "the diamond of the desert."


