On September 9, 2021, the regular Board of Directors meeting of the Southern Nevada Gem and Mineral Society was called to order at 4:00 PM by the President. All board members except for the Past President were present.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Minutes of the Previous Meeting read by Secretary were approved as read.

Treasurers Report: Account Balances were reported.

Shop report:

Everything is up and running. A sign needs to be posted in the saw room informing users not to move any of the belts on the saws except by shop supervisor.

Unfinished business:

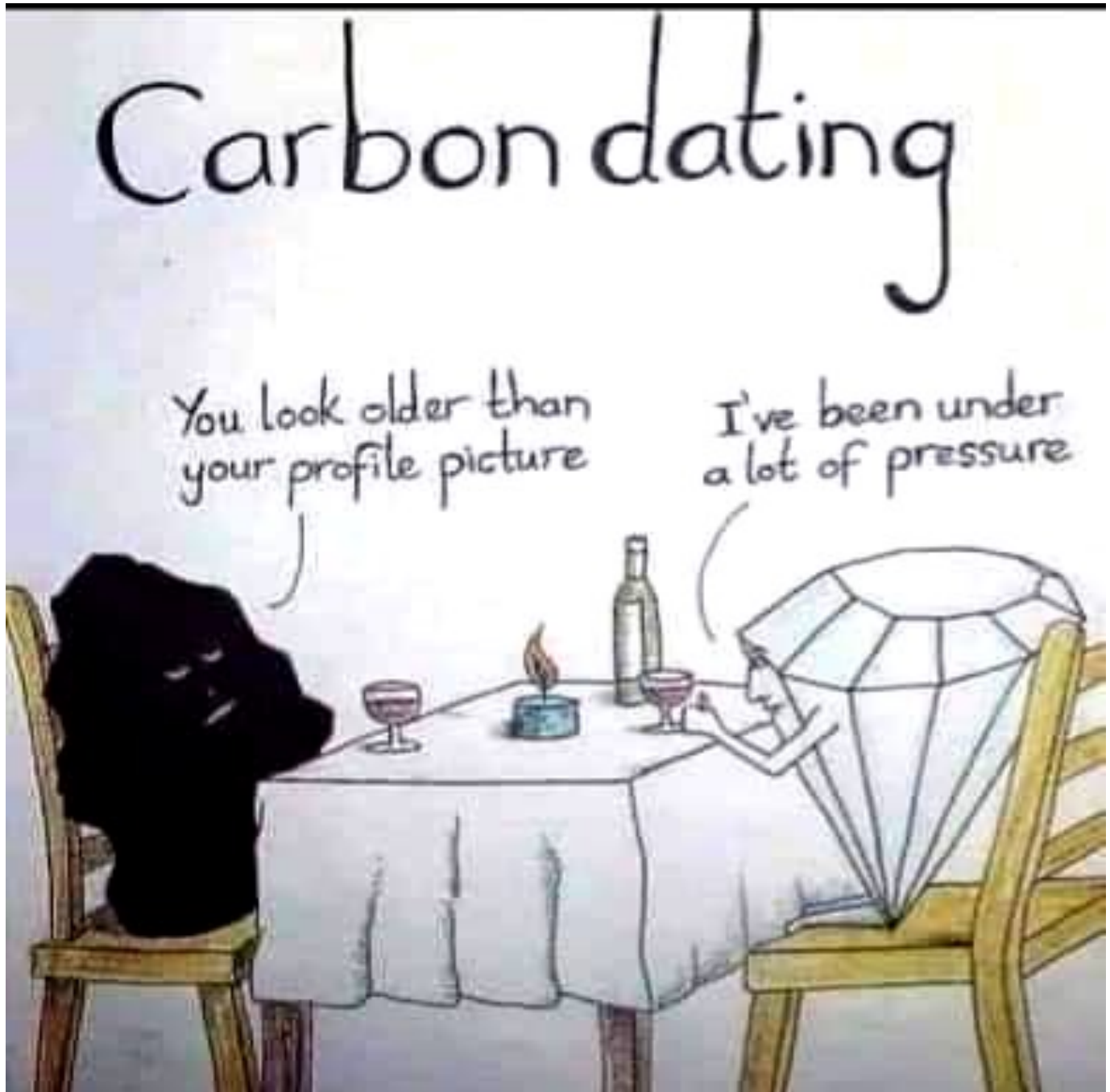
The first meeting for the 2022 Spring Jamboree will be held on September 16, 2021 at Desert Art Supplies beginning a 4:00PM.

Birthstone for the Month of September is Sapphire: Sapphire is a precious gemstone, a variety of the mineral corundum, an aluminum oxide ($\alpha\text{-Al}_2\text{O}_3$). It is typically blue, but natural "fancy" sapphires also occur in yellow, purple, orange, and green colors; "parti sapphires" show two or more colors. The only color which sapphire cannot be is red – as red colored corundum is called ruby, another corundum variety. Pink colored corundum may be either classified as ruby or sapphire depending on locale. Sapphire symbolizes faith. It's blue color represents the sky as well as loyalty and friendship. Magical powers have been ascribed to this stone. Hildegard von Bingen is said to have used it successfully in treating people possessed by the devil.

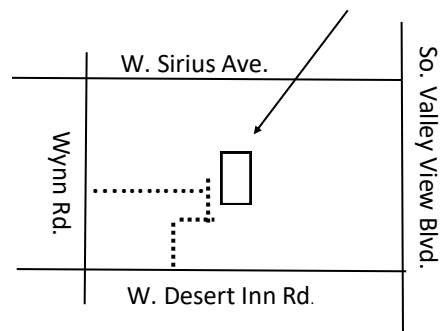

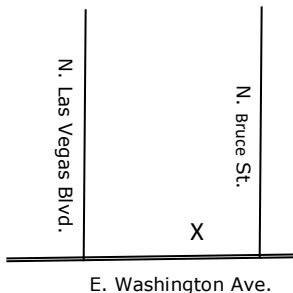

Shop Talk : Brad's Bench Tips

JUST A DROP

Hobby shops and model airplane stores carry small plastic dispenser bottles that are handy for putting a drop of flux, oil, or glue just where you want it. They have a length of small metal tubing coming out the top that lets you squeeze out very small drops.

I use one with a short length of tubing for oil when I'm sawing or when drilling harder metals like steel. Another bottle I found in a plastics store has a longer length of metal tubing on it. Plastics people use them for dispensing fast drying glues to join pieces of acrylic. The long metal tube lets you reach into tight places. Either of these is handy for flux at the soldering station.



FOREDOM MAINTENANCE

If you have a Foredom flexshaft, it makes sense to check it over every so often to be sure it's running properly. But how to do that? You've probably lost the little booklet that came with the unit. Well, being the good company it is, Foredom has put together an extensive set of videos on how to everything.

The series covers set-up, lubrication, replacing a sheath, motor maintenance, and handpiece maintenance. Few if any special tools are needed.
