Let's review your membership requirements in order to run for elected office. You must be a member in good standing with a minimum of two (2) years of uninterrupted membership in order to run. This is a question that came up at last night's meeting. In other words, if you forget to renew your membership, or let it lapse for any reason, you can reinstate your membership, within the delinquent year, by paying the \$5.00 reinstatement fee at the time of your renewal. 




KIDS CLUB / EDUCATION ACTIVITIES

Recent education activities have included a presentation at a North Las Vegas school by Mary Beth Paladino with assistance from Scott Edwards.




