MARCH **BIRTHSTONE**

AQUAMARINE (Beryllium aluminum silicate)

In the 19th century the preferred color for aguamarine was sea green, and indeed the name itself means seawater. Today the most valued colors are sky blue and dark blue. Aquamarine is dichroic, appearing blue or colorless as the stone is viewed from different angles. Gem-quality aquamarine is found as hexagonal crystals, which may be up to 39 inches long and flawless, with striations along the length of the crystal. Aguamarine is often cut with the table facet parallel to the length of the crystal in order to emphasize the deepest coloration.

The best of the gem-quality aguamarine is found in Brazil, where it occurs in pegmatites and alluvial deposits of gravel, locally called cascalho. Other localities include the Urals (Russia), Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, and. more recently exploited, Nigeria. A dark blue variety occurs in Madagascar.

HAIR SPRAY?

To find the picture in your slab to mark where you want to cut a cabochon you spray it with water, right? "WRONG"! Spray that slab with unscented hair spray. Spray them all and you can find one quick next time. It leaves a shinny smooth finish that is easily washed off.

Use hairspray on your display minerals too. It brings out the color and dust does not cling to them. That means less soaking in hot water to keep them clean. **Be sure to use unscented spray**, as the minerals seem to trap and intensify any perfume odor.

"IT TAKES A SLOW HAND"

Start cutting slowly and carefully increase the pressure when sawing. It will help keep your stone from splintering on the edges. Remember, "SLOW" is the magic word.

POLISHING TIGEREYE

Polish your stone, then dry it. Apply some vinegar and let it dry for a couple minutes, then polish it again. You should notice a better finish. Vinegar helps in polishing other stone too.




