

Upcoming Events

Ely NV area - June 14 - 17. An annual camp out near Ely NV is another SNGMS activity. This year it will be at the Illipah Recreation area and is scheduled for June 14 through 17th (Thursday through Sunday). Hotel accommodations are available in Ely if you don't like to camp. **Hope you made your reservations already** - other activities in the area are filling the rooms quickly! Again the activities include field trips in the area. Illipah Reservoir Campground is located 40 miles west of Ely on US 50. It is a free BLM campground. Access to the camp is down a good 2 mile gravel road (signed from the highway). More detailed directions are: 37 miles west of Ely on U.S. Hwy 50, turn at the highway sign for Illipah



Reservoir and continue 0.1 miles to a road junction, turn left and continue 1.3 miles to the campground. The road is 2WD accessible. Fishing is available, and there are several ghost towns and mining camps within a few miles of the campground.




Come Early!



Remember to clean up any area or equipment you use at the SNGMS Shop. Don't leave a mess for someone else! A cleaning checklist is posted in the shop by the Genies, please read and follow it.

Note the change in shop fees—we are installing meters on all the slab saws, the trim saws, and the Genies. The meters will allow us to charge in tenths of an hour instead of 15 minute increments. The trim saw charge will be increased to \$5 an hour, or \$0.50 for 1/10th of an hour with no minimum charge. Since few people use the trim saw for an entire hour this will generally result in a more equitable charge for usage.

Metered Equipment:

Trim Saws - \$0.50 per 1/10 hour actual use.

Other - \$5.00 for first hour; prorated \$0.50 per additional 1/10 hour increment


Non-Metered Equipment:

Turquoise/Opal Saw—\$3.00 for first hour; prorated \$0.75 per additional 1/4 hour increment
