Why You Should Pay Your Dues Before February 1st

The last date to renew your membership, is January 31st. A renewal after the end of January will result in an interruption in your membership. You must never allow your membership to lapse if you want to maintain continuous (uninterrupted) membership.



Reasons to keep an uninterrupted membership:

- 1 You must have a minimum of two uninterrupted years of membership in order to run for president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer or parliamentarian.
- 2 You must have a minimum of one uninterrupted year of membership in order to run for a director position or to chair a committee.
- 3 You must have 10 uninterrupted years of membership to be considered for life membership.



If you are a Genie user you have probably noticed that the third wheel on all the Genies has become very worn. They are being replaced with new wheels.

Please be sure that all the grinding/shaping has been accomplished on the first two wheels of the Genie *BEFORE* you move to the third one. Three and beyond are for polishing only, and moving to the third wheel too soon is responsible for the excessive wear we are seeing. Moving your stone to use the entire width of the wheel and not moving to the polishing wheels too soon will keep the wheels in good condition much longer, allowing us to make better use of our maintenance dollars.

We still have an abundance of donated rock material in the shop. Stop in and take a look—if you are working it in the SNGMS Shop it is free, if you are working it at home it is \$2.00 a pound.

New users just need to come in, we'll even give you a slab to make your first cabochon from. No additional equipment or experience is necessary, we have everything you need to get started doing lapidary work, and will teach you all the basics at any time that the shop is open.

Thanks for all the paper towel donations - the response was very good and we are so appreciative.

Due to lack of use, the shop is open by appointment only on Sundays (except the second Sunday of the month) Call Lori Green at 702-255-9594 by the Saturday prior to the Sunday you want to come in, and plan to spend at least two hours working in the shop.


